The Flexible Workforce Development Fund is available to all Scottish employers, including small and medium enterprises (SMEs). The Fund supports businesses in Scotland to up-skill and re-skill their employees to support inclusive economic growth in Scotland. As an employer you can use it to address priority skills gaps and get training tailored to your needs.

Who can access it?

The Fund provides funding to UK Apprenticeship Levy-payers and SMEs in Scotland.

What can it be used for?

The FWDF is intended to help employers address priority skills gaps and training needs. If you're a UK Apprenticeship Levy-paying business or an SME in Scotland, you can use the FWDF to upskill or reskill your staff.

Arla run a ground-breaking education initiative called 'Eden'. This initiative, driven by the UK dairy industry, provides an Advanced Apprenticeship for Engineers and a Foundation Degree qualification for Dairy Technologists, with the aim of producing world class staff for tomorrow's dairy industry. The Flexible Workforce Development Fund has allowed the company to put recent 'Eden Graduates' on enhanced health & safety training like NEBOSH and IOSH. Other staff, who have been ear-marked to step into team leading roles have undergone ILM Leadership. Hence, so far over 25 staff have benefitted directly from the additional training, which in turn has improved efficiencies and effectiveness of this team on this key production site in the south of Scotland.
