10 Criminal Convictions

In order to help Dumfries and Galloway College meet its duty of care to its staff, students and others, we must know about any relevant criminal convictions that you have.

Relevant criminal convictions are only those convictions for offences against the person, of a violent or sexual nature, and convictions for offences involving unlawfully supplying controlled drugs or substances where the conviction concerns commercial drug dealing or trafficking. Convictions that are spent (as defined by the Rehabilitation of offenders Act 1974) are not considered to be relevant and need not be revealed. For the avoidance of doubt any custodial sentence of over thirty months must be declared.

If you have a relevant criminal conviction that is not spent, you must enter X in the Yes box below. If you don't have any unspent criminal convictions, please leave the box blank.

If you enter an X in the box below, you will be automatically excluded from the applications process. However, the college may wish to consider the application further or ask for more information before making a decision.

You should be aware that for courses in teaching, health care, social care, sports and leisure or courses involving work with children, young people or vulnerable adults, any criminal conviction, including sentences and cautions (including verbal cautions), reprimands, final warnings and bind-over orders are exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974. If you are applying for these courses, the college will ask you to agree to have a criminal record check. You may also need an 'enhanced disclosure certificate' from the Scottish Criminal Records Disclosure Service. This means that if the criminal record check identifies that you have been charged or had a conviction, this information will be made available to the college. If you are convicted of a relevant criminal offence after you have applied, you must tell the college. The College may then ask for more details.

11 Personal Statement

International applicants are required to hand write a minimum 500 words personal statement and enclose with your application. The personal statement should include:

- Why you wish to study in the UK and reasons for choosing Dumfries and Galloway College in Scotland.
- Reasons for choosing the particular course applied for.
- An outline of your skills, knowledge and experience relevant to the course.
- Your career aspirations, stating your short, medium and long term goals.

You must sign and date the personal statement and provide the contact details for the faculty to arrange an inter-view. This should include telephone contact numbers.
